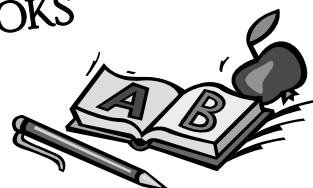

Six Ideas for the Mentor Session

Read Old Favorites: *Reading a favorite book builds self confidence and builds excitement for something we enjoy.*

Read TOGETHER: *When a child reads to you, the child should know 90 - 95% of the words on a page for effective reading practice.*

Talk About Words: *Introduce new words and build vocabulary while reading books.*

Write Together: *Help your student write just one sentence about the story.*

Read for Enjoyment: *The key to motivation is make it FUN!*

Summarize Success: *Praise and review all that a student has accomplished, discuss what went well and what might be worked on next time.*
